Terry Peiper, "Helped Horses With Their People" in Maryland and Pennsylvania as an instructor and trainer for over 35 years. She is an accredited Richard Shrake Resistance Free[®] Trainer/Instructor and certified American Riding Instructors Association (ARIA) Instructor. She has more than 45 years horse showing experience in several different disciplines, as well as several years of fox hunting, barrel racing and open show judging experience. You could say she has been there and done that.

In 2010, she began studying saddle ergonomics (interfacing saddle, rider and horse to become one) when she realized that the saddle fit had a huge impact on the horses she was working with. What started out as just another way for Terry to help her students, quickly took over her life when she discovered that her heart horse, Easy, had a condition called kissing spines and none of her saddles fit him properly. She had been riding him in barrel racing and dressage

saddles that were too long putting painful pressure on his kissing spines (arthritic lumbar) and too narrow in the channel aggravating the supraspinous ligament... “I can’t go back and undo what I have done but I can spread the word about proper saddle fit to prevent other horses from needless suffering” says Terry.

Now in Tennessee, Terry passionately pursues her mission to educate as many riders as possible of the importance of proper saddle fit, how it affects the horse’s performance, behavior and ultimately horse and rider health through individual saddle fit evaluations, interactive seminars and presentations.

She is currently employed at Schreiber Center for Pediatric Development in Lancaster, PA and works at the WellSpan Surgery and Rehab Hospital in York, PA. Not currently active in the horse world, Sarah is always looking for an opportunity to get back in the saddle and continue her passion of incorporating hippotherapy into her occupational therapy practice.

Ann O’Shallie, holds a B.S. in Equine Science from the University of Maryland and a M.Ed. from Penn State University. She has been active in the field of equine assisted activities for the last 40 years. O’Shallie is a Professor at Wilson College where she wrote and implemented the curriculum for a four-year B.S. degree in Equine Assisted Therapeutics (therapeutic horsemanship) which has been growing successfully for 20 years and boasts many talented and active graduates. In addition, four years ago she wrote and implemented the curriculum for a four-year B.S. degree in Animal Studies – with a focus on behavior, ethical management and conservation.
